Car Park Charges 2020/21

- Car parking charges at Chapel Street and Butler Road car parks will remain unchanged.
- Free parking after 15.00 will also continue.
- It is proposed to maintain the cost of parking permits at the current rate for all four car parks
- It is proposed to convert 2 bays at Chapel Street Car park into Electric vehicle parking bays. These will be at right hand side of the Chapel Street car park near to the attendants' hut, as this is adjacent to the source of electricity. They will be 22kw fast chargers which will need a maximum of 4 hours to charge a car. There will be restrictions allowing a stay of 4 hours only in the bays. Cars may not park in the bays unless they are charging their vehicle. Users will not need to buy a ticket, but will pay for the electricity through a pay-as-you-go card system. The parking order will need to be changed to this effect. Offences will be:
 - Parking in an EV bay when not using the chargepoint, with or without a ticket
 - Parking in an EV bay for longer than 4 hours
- On-street Residential Chargepoint Scheme (**ORCS**) will provide grants for fast chargers at 22KW and would provide 75% of the cost
- The maximum paid by ORCS for chargepoints is £7500 per point
- For 2 points the grant would be around £15,000
- HTC would have to fund the other 25% of the cost at £5000 – this amount has been provided for in the budget

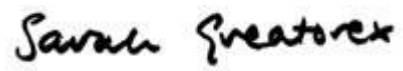
The grant is available for capital costs:

- The purchase of the charging unit
- The purchase cost of electrical components related to the chargepoint including Distribution Network Operator connection costs
- The cost of civil engineering works related to the installation
- Labour costs of the installation
- Hardware costs of the installation
- The capital costs of a parking bay and parking order (paint and signage)

Recommendation: that Council approves:

1. No change in parking charges or permit charges for any car parks

2. The installation of 2 EV parking bays near to the attendants' but in Chapel Street car park
